Special Guest - Dee Daniels

Dee Daniels is a crowd pleaser and a musician's musician. Whether accompanying herself at the piano, fronting a trio, big band or symphony, she is a unique talent who transcends musical borders when she brings her jazz styling, infused with gospel and blues flavoring, to the stage.

The stepdaughter of a Baptist minister, Dee was born and raised in Oakland, CA. Though she graduated from university with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Art Education, music was always a big part of her life. However, she didn't discover her true calling to it until after teaching art in a Seattle high school for a year. She then joined a band, resigned her teaching position, and the rest is history!

She has since traveled the world with her music. She has shared the stage and/or recorded with numerous legends of jazz including Houston Person, Monty Alexander, John Clayton, Russell Malone, Cyrus Chestnut, Ken Peplowski, and Lewis Nash to mention a few. Her diverse career has seen her in clubs, on festivals, prestigious music halls around the world, theater stages, television and radio, performances for royalty and international dignitaries, and on many recordings as leader or guest.

Dee has also established herself as a jazz vocalist in demand by the classical world, performing her five symphonic Pops programs with orchestras in the US, Canada, and Europe. Many organizations and institutions in and out of the music industry have recognized Dee with awards for her contributions in music, education, and community service.

Emcee Abe Beeson

Abe grew up in Western Washington, a third generation Seattle/Tacoma kid. As a student at Pacific Lutheran University, Abe landed his first job at KNKX, editing and producing audio for news stories. A Christmas Day

shift no one else wanted gave Abe his first on-air experience which led to overnights, Saturday afternoons, and then a 20-year stretch hosting Evening Jazz beginning in 1998.

A longtime donor to several non-profit arts organizations, Abe joined the board of the Seattle Repertory Jazz Orchestra in 2017. He's proud to support the SRJO's mission to bring the live big band jazz experience to audiences around Western Washington and beyond.

Michael Brockman

Saxophone

Michael is the co-founder/artistic director of the SRJO and has been a faculty member of the UW School of Music since 1987, instructing saxophone performance and jazz arranging. He studied saxophone and composition at the New England Conservatory, the Berklee College of Music and the Musikhochschule at the University of Cologne.

He has recorded with groups in Washington D.C. and Boston, and in Seattle with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra and the Clarence Acox Sextet. Brockman was presented the Champion of the Arts Award from the Kirkland Performance Center. He is director of the UW's highly regarded "Jazz in Paris" program. He was inducted into the Seattle Jazz Hall of Fame in 2019.

Randy Halberstadt

Piano

Randy has appeared with national artists such as Terry Gibbs, Buddy DeFranco, Herb Ellis, Grace Kelly, Mimi Fox, Kevin Mahogany, Sheila Jordan, Bobby Shew, Marlena Shaw, and Jeff Hamilton. He is featured on numerous recordings with the top names in NW jazz, including singers Jay Clayton, Gail Pettis, Greta Matassa, and the Clarence Acox Sextet. He has four recordings of his own and is the author of an instructional text, *Metaphors For The Musician: Perspectives From A Jazz Pianist* (Sher Music Publishing).

Phil Sparks

Bass

Phil is among the leading bassists in Seattle, having performed with nearly every top jazz group in the city. He records extensively with many of the Northwest's top names and received a special mention as a star of the Seattle scene in *Down Beat Magazine*. Sparks has performed and recorded extensively with many of the Northwest's top names in jazz and appears on dozens of award-winning compact discs.

D'Vonne Lewis

Drums

D'Vonne is the grandson of the 'Godfather' of rock and roll/soul, 1950s Northwest organ legend, Dave Lewis. D'Vonne graduated from Seattle's Roosevelt High School and was a member of the award-winning jazz band, directed by SRJO trombonist, Scott Brown. While in high school, D'Vonne received the Essentially Ellington Drum soloist award three years in a row. Lewis extensively tours and performs various gigs in styles ranging from jazz, funk, hip-hop, rock, Brazilian and African.

He has recorded with Hadley Caliman; Floyd Standifer; Marc Seales; Larry Fuller; and a number of national artists. Lewis composes for his own bands: 'D'Vonne Lewis NW D'Lux', 'Limited Edition' and 'DL4tet'. D'Vonne has received the Earshot Golden Ear Award for 'Emerging Artist' and three Earshot Golden Ear Awards for 'Instrumentalist of the Year.' He is also the VP of the Seattle Jazz Fellowship Board.

Dan Marcus

Lead Trombone

Dan started playing semi-professionally at age nine alongside his father in several Bay-area Dixie bands. He toured extensively with the Ray Charles and Woody Herman Orchestras, among others. Dan performed for a number of years in Teatro Zinzanni and now appears regularly with the Oliver Groenewald "NewNet," Jay Thomas' "Cantaloupes," "The DNA Trio" with his brother, Michael, and son, Max; along with extensive arranging, freelancing, studio and Broadway musical work at the 5th Avenue and Paramount Theatres.

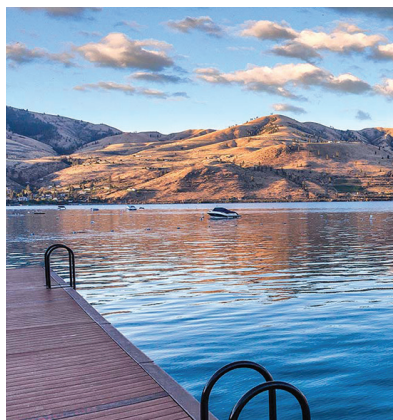

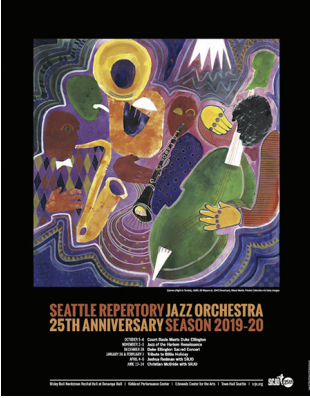

LECTURE ONE - Sunday, May 4, 2:00-4:30pm in Seattle

Co-hosted by Ken Steiner: Ken is a SRJO board member and co-founder of the Seattle Jazz Fellowship. He first fell under the spell of Duke Ellington's music when he heard Duke in concert at Georgetown University on February 10, 1974. He's been researching Ellington ever since.

Co-hosted by Jim Wilke: Jim Wilke was a Seattle radio host beginning in 1961, co-founded the Seattle Jazz Society, taught jazz history at Cornish and Bellevue colleges, and produced Jazz After Hours on Public Radio International winning the Willis Conover/Marian McPartland Award for top national jazz program. His live Seattle jazz recordings include the SRJO and many historic touring jazz legends. **Value: \$40 per person**
